Did you know...?

The Civil War in Tremont - A Memoir

Last week's article, "A Young Soldier's Thoughts," dealt with Cpl. Thomas McClure, a young Civil War Soldier from Tremont. It included excerpts from letters he wrote from a Memphis, Tennessee Smallpox hospital, far from home and family.

Recently, Ina Eckhoff donated a copy of "Memories of My Life 1831-1915," by Christian Hellemann, Sr., to the Tremont Museum. Christian was Ina's great grandfather. His memories make for fascinating reading, as he relates his story from the time he was a young man in Germany who lived a very rough life with little prospect of making a success of himself. His dream of coming to America to live and seek opportunity came true in 1854.

After many adventures, struggles, and some successes, Christian decided to move from the Saint Louis area to Tremont. Along the way, he met Peter Menard (of the now historic "Red Brick" Jones-Menard House), who became his very generous and loyal benefactor. As he states in his memoir:

"Now I was a farmer. I had two horses and a freshened cow. The year 1860 was a good one; everything grew fabulously..."

But Christian continues:

"The terrible Civil War broke out during the spring of 1861; money became more rare, and silver money (coins) were not to be seen until 1879. Nearly every business printed their own script.

"The government was compelled to issue paper money in small denominations of 5, 10, 25, and 50 cents. Everything increased in price...Corn and oats were very cheap during the summer of 1861. We had debts. We could not borrow enough money as everyone wanted his part. Corn cost in Pekin 12 cents, and oats 10 cents per bushel; we had nearly 800 bushels of corn to sell."



1862 Fractional Currency 5 cents. The first series was called Postal Currency because the designs were based on postage stamps.

During that hard time, Christian earned some side income by hauling corn to the distillery in Wesley City (Creve Coeur), and by hauling nails that were shipped into Peoria to a merchant in Wesley City who had ordered them. He made five round trips in a week.

“My dear wife, as well as I, slept little during that time; however, we did not lack anything in our household then because we had 10 dollars on account for us in the merchant’s shop; also we were able to pay our debts.”

In 1862, Christian and his friend, Michael Ritthaler, became partners and rented 20 additional acres from Dr. Saltonstahl. They signed a contract to deliver 400 bushels of corn as rent. However, as Christian wrote:

“This piece of land was very flat and was not drained; additionally, it was badly trampled by a herd of horses and cows. (Note – at that time, many animals roamed freely). Also, it rained. After the corn was up, we were unable to cultivate with a horse to clean out weeds; days on end we worked with hoes, weeding without much success. Our other work suffered very much by this.

“So we had poor prospects for harvest...Once again, during August, President Lincoln called for 500,000 soldiers; Illinois had to do its part to this.”

Christian bought Michael’s part of the prospective harvest, and his partner joined the 82nd Illinois Infantry Regiment and served three years until the end of the war.

In 1865 the long war finally ended, and some things started to look up:

“(Farming) started out well; then during the month of June the dreaded grain weevil came in billions and destroyed in an unbelievable short time wheat, barley, and oats. From there it went to corn; row after row was destroyed until we got rid of this pest during a strong thunderstorm with heavy rain.”

Though there were some setbacks, through the years Christian became very successful, buying a great deal of land. Christian always felt he had made the correct decision to come to America. His memoir ends with a poem:

Hail Columbus! Be praised.
Honored forever,
You have shown us a path,
He who dares can become free
From hard servitude.
