Roboteers 2024 Summer Science Camps - June 1st & 4th

Exciting news -- the Roboteers are hosting Science Camps this summer!

- The one-day camps are June 1st and June 4th for K-7th grade at the Roboteers Robotics Center behind the junior high school.
- Campers will be grouped based on current grade level: K/1st, 2nd/3rd, 4th/5th, 6th/7th graders.
- The cost is \$30 per camper per camp day or \$50 per camper if you participate in both camp days for their grade level.

Camps include:

Day 1: Current Kindergarteners-3rd Graders

June 1st - 9:00-11:30am

This camp will focus on learning basic skills we use in the robot shop (programming, electrical circuits, design, etc). Students will have an opportunity to see and interact with this year's robot.

Did You Know....?

1834 Journey to Tremont

Recently, someone asked what route the New York group used to come and settle Tremont in 1834. I had no positive answer. But the 1895 Pantagraph (Bloomington, Illinois) had a letter to the editor that gives us an answer.

Cushing Jones wrote that in the fall of 1834, he was ten years old. Along with his father's family, he traveled with the first group to arrive in Tremont, accompanied by Mr. J. L. James, the originator of the colony. Here is his explanation of the route they took:

"A number of families met in New York City and started for Illinois about the 1st of October, 1834. We went up the Hudson to Albany, then to Schenectady by rail, to Buffalo by canal, across Lake Erie to Cleveland, across the state of Ohio by canal to Portsmouth, down the Ohio River to Cairo, up the Mississippi River to St. Louis, and were to go up the Illinois River to Pekin, but the river was so low we did not get any farther than the mouth of Apple Creek, and got teams to take us to Jacksonville, where we stayed that winter. In the spring of 1835 we came to Tremont, or where Tremont now is. The first house, or first two houses, were raised the same day, one in the morning and the other in the afternoon, by agreement with the parties on account of help to raise the frame.

"I have a deed that was given to my father April 7, 1835, for 637 acres of land and sixteen lots in and near the town of Tremont, and signed by the men who laid out the town of

Tremont. They were Josiah L, James, William Sampson and John H. Harris, and it was recorded at Pekin by J. C. Morgan."

The thought of a trip like that today would be tiring, but in those early days, the trip by boat, rail, and wagon would have been more than exhausting, though maybe thrilling, as well. To be a part of starting a new town would certainly be memorable.
