The 58th Annual Tremont Turkey Festival will be underway June 7-9 to bring friends and neighbors from all around the area to enjoy a full weekend of food, fun, and festivities!

Start the second day of the festival off with a refreshing job in the country when you participate in the 48th annual Tremont Turkey Festival 5K Race on Saturday, June 8th at 7:30 AM! Registrations received by May 26 are priced at \$30 and participants are guaranteed a race t-shirt. Entries received May 27 or after are at a higher price, and shirts are not guaranteed. Complete details on registration prices can be found on the race registration site linked above.

All runners must check in on race day from 6:15 AM to 7:30 AM. The start time for the 5K race is 7:30 AM. Please note that there are no pre-race day packet pick ups.

The race is professionally timed with splits provided at each mile. A trophy presentation at the pavilion will immediately follow the race. The following awards are given:

- Overall Awards: Top (1) Male and Top (1) Female (gun time)
- Tremont Resident Awards: Top (1) Male and Top (1) Female (gun time)
- Age Group Awards: Top 3 Male and Top 3 Female (gun time) in each of the following categories: 10 & Under, 11-14, 15-19, 20-24, 25-29, 30-34, 35-39, 40-44, 45-49, 50-54, 55-59, 60 & Over

Roboteers 2024 Summer Science Camps - June 1st & 4th

Exciting news -- the Roboteers are hosting Science Camps this summer!

- The one-day camps are June 1st and June 4th for K-7th grade at the Roboteers Robotics Center behind the junior high school.
- Campers will be grouped based on current grade level: K/1st, 2nd/3rd, 4th/5th, 6th/7th graders.
- The cost is \$30 per camper per camp day or \$50 per camper if you participate in both camp days for their grade level.

Camps include:

Day 1: Current Kindergarteners-3rd Graders

June 1st - 9:00-11:30am

This camp will focus on learning basic skills we use in the robot shop (programming, electrical circuits, design, etc). Students will have an opportunity to see and interact with this year's robot.

Day 2: Current Kindergarteners-3rd Graders

June 4th - 9:00-11:30am

This camp will be a little crazy and a little wild! We will be exploring a vast array of fun science experiments and chemical reactions! We will also learn all about cotton candy and enjoy it as a tasty treat (no red dye 40)!

Day 1: Current 4th Graders - 7th Graders

June 1st - 12:30-3:00pm

Come learn about the various subgroups we have for building our robot! You'll learn about programming, computer aided design, electrical, and more!

Day 2: Current 4th Graders - 7th Graders

June 4th - 12:30-3:00pm

Did You Know....?

Turn of the Century Obituaries

Francis Nabor* Dead *Not actual last name

From the Tremont News, August 6, 1901:

"Francis Nabor died at the county farm Saturday evening, after a short illness, and was buried Sunday.

"It seems strange and hardly fair (that) one who was possessed of so much wealth a few years ago should die in the poor house. Money all gone, friends gone, and cast out without a place to lay his head, only at the county house. Some will say he ought to have known better; perhaps he had, but if he didn't there should have been a conservator appointed for him.

"We have known the deceased for a great many years, and we do not think that he ever saw the bright side of life for a single day, but perhaps he was not to blame. All that can be said now that he is gone is, 'poor old man.'

Generally, obituaries do not speak ill of the dead, though some, like the one above, are the exception! In fact, around the turn of the century, the opposite was usually the case, with glowing and flowery tributes to the deceased, especially the women. An example is:

The Death of Mrs. Estella Norman

Tremont News, 1923:

"... She was a woman highly respected by all who knew her. One who was very generous

and kind to all her neighbors and friends and was never so happy as when she could do someone a kind act. While she was ill during the Holidays, she thought of others and sent presents, and to the sick, boxes of fruits and words of cheer. Her passing will be keenly felt in this community where she had resided most of her entire life and the heartfelt sympathy of the entire community goes out to the husband and children of a faithful and loving wife and kind and indulgent mother."

Small town newspapers rarely had an obituary writer on staff. Often, the obituaries were written by the funeral home director. The trend was to extoll the virtues that were valued by the community, such as Christian faith, generosity, kindness, motherhood, and friendliness. Other adjectives included honorable, frank, honest and loving.

These obituaries were more like eulogies than objective death notices. They often contained flowery descriptions that could not always be trusted as fact.

During the Industrial Revolution, men were no longer remembered so much for their attributes. Instead, many obituaries focused on the prominence and wealth of the deceased, such as for Tremont's Thomas A. Davis in 1899:

"(He was) reputed to be one of the wealthiest residents...he owned considerable land... he amassed an immense fortune."


